Lincoln Memorial

bat houses and a twochambered rocket box,
built by local Eagle Scout,
Gage Homan. Homan
stated the project wasn't
without its challenges
and "found out that
sometimes even though
the plans were detailed,

bat houses.



The Garden's previous bat houses were damaged by weather and ornery woodpeckers. Homan was thoughtful to select plans that included multiple chambers and vents to allow thorough air flow and heat distribution to keep bats well acclimated, in addition to nursery chambers that can house baby bats, also called pups. Bat populations are slow-growing; females often have only one pup a year, so the need for warm, safe housing is essential.

The two-chambered rocket box is the larger of Homan's builds and can hold roughly 200



bats. This style, mounted on a pole rather than the side of a building or natural structure, will soon replace the barn owl box located at the Ostermeier Prairie Center which has lacked a resident for several years. The Illinois Bat Conservation Program has equipped the Garden with acoustic monitoring equipment that

records echolocation calls; this will allow for identification of bat species and the Garden locations they favor.

The Garden welcomes scouts and students to explore their interests and try their hand at new skills. Before deciding on a service project, Homan recommends brainstorming with Scout Masters or fellow peers, and he encourages others to consider their interests and how they can contribute to their community.

Keep an eye out for Homan's bat houses throughout the Garden and Ostermeier Prairie Center. Additionally, mark your calendars and join us for Family Friday Night on May 19 to learn more about bats and how you can help with acoustic monitoring in the Garden! ∞
